As an organization aiming to serve the entire Texas A&M population, it is critical for The 12<sup>th</sup> Can to uphold the Aggie core values and the values of The 12<sup>th</sup> Can in pursuit of a welcoming and inclusive environment that is void of prejudice or racial discrimination. The 12<sup>th</sup> Can's volunteers undergo thorough civil rights training, bringing attention to any biases volunteers have, to enhance volunteers' abilities to treat all other members and clients fairly. The 12<sup>th</sup> Can holds its volunteers and clients accountable by encouraging clients and volunteers to file a formal complaint for any experience in which they might have felt unwelcome, for any reason.

The 12<sup>th</sup> Can was founded on the idea that Aggies help *all* Aggies and, seven years later, The 12<sup>th</sup> Can continues to live by this mantra to selflessly serve the community that has given each of The 12<sup>th</sup> Can's members so many meaningful experiences.
